
Aspects of Practice 2014 Beginner's Mind: Exploring Suzuki Roshi's Unpublished Koan Talks Saturday, October 18 - Saturday, Nov. 15

Aspects of Practice—led by BZC Senior Students Denkei Raul Moncayo, Laurie Senauke, Ron Nestor, Ryushin Andrea Thach, Greg Denny, and Gerry Oliva—will begin with the opening sesshin on Saturday, October 18, and continue through the closing sesshin on Saturday, November 15.

As always, this is an opportunity for new and old students to sit and study together, and also share work, practice discussion, and tea. The complete calendar of events is available in this newsletter and on our website.

This year we will be delving into some of Suzuki Roshi's unpublished talks on koans, exploring these in lectures and classes; we will also show a short movie of Suzuki Roshi. Some study materials will be available in advance.

It's Time for Sejiki! Saturday, October 25

Sejiki is a popular buddhist festival that highlights the connection between our world and the worlds of spirits. At BZC, we offer it as a sort of Buddhist Halloween. The ceremony is a mixture of spooky and solemn—there will be costumes and noisemakers, but we will also recite the names of departed friends and family and make offerings to appease our own hungry ghosts.

This year's Sejiki ceremony will be held on Saturday, October 25. To allow preparation time for the ceremony, we will not be having early morning zazen or breakfast. Instead, we will begin with a work period at 8:30 am to prepare our temple for the ceremony. The formal program will start with zazen at 9:35, followed by a short lecture and the ceremony at 10:15. We will also be offering a special children's program beginning with a kids' activity at 9:35 am at 1933 Russell. The kids will then join the sangha for a short lecture and spooky ceremony. Everyone is encouraged to come in costume and bring noisemakers for the ceremony.

In response for more information about Ikebana (Japanese flower arranging) BZC friend Barbara Stevens Strauss is offering an Ikebana demonstration class on the evening of Wednesday, November 12, 7:00 – 9:00 at BZC member Afsaneh Michaels' art studio in West Berkeley. Although the precise origin of Ikebana is unknown, it is thought to have come to Japan as part of Buddhist practice when Buddhism reached Japan in the 6th century. You have possibly admired Barbara's arrangements at BZC's ceremonies; she is a certified Sogetsu Ikebana teacher.
